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PART II. IMPLEMENTATION OF THE YOUTH IN ACTION PROGRAMME

STRATEGIC MANAGEMENT

1. NATIONAL CONTEXT AND OBJECTIVES IN THE FIELD OF YOUTH

State of play of development of youth work at local and national level

In the view of the National agency of the YOUTH IN ACTION programme in Slovenia (NAG) the situation of the field of youth work and youth policies in Slovenia can still be defined as relatively young and to certain extent relatively poorly developed due to:

- Lack of any formal responsibility of local authorities concerning youth in general and in particular any measures of policies concerning youth as a field of policies. In many situations, activities of young people are considered as leisure time activities without additional level in terms of context of non-formal education and the need to encourage (political) participation. Bridges with more traditional recognised areas of education are weak if existent at all.
- Lack of any legislative concerning youth work and youth policies. The only legislation related to the field of youth as specific field is Act on youth councils, accepted by the parliament in 2000 and – as main result – 40 local youth councils, composed by a number of local voluntary youth organisations, have been registered since then as consultative and representative bodies in question related to youth at the level of municipalities but less than 50% are to be considered as active. As one of the obstacles for further development of this instrument for consultation of organised young people is definitely the size of municipalities in Slovenia, many of them with less than 3.000 inhabitants.

There is also a lack of instruments and funding to support youth work both at local and national level. The call for projects, yearly organised by the Office of RS for Youth, appears to be a main steering instrument of the future development but due to its limited overall volume (1.422.700 € in 2006) and intention to provide a global grant for yearly based programmes of work has severe handicap with average grant of 10.460 € and the maximum grant of 28.125 € each of two biggest national youth organisation.

There is no overview of funding of youth work or actors in the field of youth at local (municipalities) levels. Some – usually larger municipalities – run yearly calls for projects in youth field – and substantial of funds is intended to cover the costs of operations of actors in the field of youth established by the municipalities. In many cases, the support for public youth centres by municipalities can not be compared with low support for voluntary based youth organisations and initiatives.

In those circumstances, the previous YOUTH programme was quite often seen by actors as additional funding possibility, which has resulted in high increase of

applications for youth initiatives as the only form available within the YOUTH programme without explicit demand for transnational partnerships.

Therefore the national objectives – as far as the involvement of the National agency of the YOUTH IN ACTION programme in Slovenia (NAG) is concerned – should be:

- contribution to the development of frameworks for implementation of youth policies and youth work at local levels, by use of selection and results of projects supported by the YOUTH IN ACTION programme and by the involvement of municipalities and different actors in the field of youth as much as possible in the management and implementation of the programme and co-operation activities of the NAG intended for the promotion of the youth work and exploitation of the results achieved by the projects supported by the YOUTH IN ACTION programme.
- establishment of the link between youth work (and actors in the field of youth) with other areas of education and to contribute to the recognition of the youth work within the context of non-formal and informal learning
- encouragement of the development of additional instruments of representation of young people towards local authorities, especially in smaller municipalities, which will take into the account organised and non-organised youngsters
- promotion of stronger role for non-governmental youth organisations (membership organisation based on the principle of the representative democracy) and youth groups at local level and their involvement into the public life

Activities/events aimed at promotion of youth work at national level

Development of frameworks for youth work and youth policy at local levels

The NAG proposes to focus aim of its core activities related to the promotion of the youth work towards local authorities (municipalities) in Slovenia and with the following above mentioned strategic objectives: The strategy of the National agency towards municipalities should be based on attempt of “active engagement municipalities wherever and whenever is possible”

- to use every opportunity to present the possibilities within the YOUTH IN ACTION programme in co-operation with municipalities;
- to include presentation of good practices of active support of municipalities towards youth work and especially projects supported within the YOUTH IN ACTION programme whenever is possible during activities and events organised by the NAG

At the same time, the NAG proposes to establish a working group, composed by interested representatives of municipalities, local youth councils, national voluntary

and democratic youth organisations (nominated through National Youth Council), the NAG as well as Office of RS for Youth with aim to draft a policy paper with recommendations for the development of framework for (political) participation of youngsters at level of municipalities, which can be also supported by the YOUTH IN ACTION programme at latter stage.

A dialogue with Community of Municipalities of Slovenia and Association of municipalities of Slovenia (both represented in the Committee of Regions) should also contribute to the efforts of the NAG to contribute to the objectives.

In this respect, the NAG will seek to ensure:

- presence of information about the YOUTH IN ACTION programme during main activities of two associations of municipalities;
- use of internal publication of both association to present good practices of involvement of municipalities in YOUTH / YOUTH IN ACTION projects and their efforts to develop frameworks for youth work and youth policies at local level as well as good YOUTH IN ACTION projects with strong impact at local level;
- involvement and presence of both associations of municipalities in Slovenia in the evaluation committee;

In addition, the NAG proposes to establish a possibility for a partnership between the NAG and limited number of the local authorities aimed at the development of the framework for youth work and youth policy development. The partnership should be based on longer time frame, current situation analyses and action plan for each such partnership. The partnership should be focused on the:

- Development of tools and instrument for consultation between young people and local authorities and their services, including tools for information work with aim to increase participation of young people

Links with other educational areas

As far as bridges to educational field in general are concerned, the NAG proposes to adopt a strategy of "gradual encounters" between actors in the field of youth and actors in more traditionally recognized areas / frameworks of education. The strategy should be implemented through the following measures:

- Measures intended for the promotion of the YOUTH IN ACTION programme among relevant institutions in the field of education, including EUROPASS, Pedagogical Institute, Andragogical Community, etc.
- Measures intended for the involvement of relevant institutions in the field of education in the evaluation of the projects implementation, especially with their presence and input during the monitoring meetings

1.2.3 Special Events

The NAG proposes to combine the aims of activities with needs related to the promotion of the youth work in general as well as needs for the quality development of the programme. In general terms, the particular activity itself should be more focused on the needs of the programme development, but the preparation as well as exploitation of results of such activities should foresee also possibility for broader impacts.

1.2.3.1 National Conference: Non formal learning and youth work

The NAG proposes to prepare and organise this Conference with aim to underline the importance of the learning experiences of youth work for young people and give more highlight to the educational aspect of youth work. Participants of this conference should be beside beneficiaries of the YOUTH / YOUTH in action programme also key persons in structures in the field of youth and education in Slovenia as well as decision makers, including member of the European parliament.

The event should serve as a link with other players in the field of education and therefore the NAG will made an effort to ensure one of the key speakers also from more traditionally accepted educational institutions to present their view concerning the non formal education in the youth work. The event should also come up with recommendations for longer term strategies concerning bridges between youth work and other areas of education, especially those traditionally more recognized.

1.2.3.2 Yearly meeting of beneficiaries

The NAG proposes to prepare and organise the meeting of beneficiaries benefiting from YOUTH IN ACTION programme as well as YOUTH programme towards the end of the year 2007. The meeting should have important part dedicated to the presentation and promotion of good practices within YOUTH / YOUTH IN ACTION projects and – this year – the focus should be on the long term impact of those projects for the work within the organisation or in the existence of the group.

1.2.4 Publications

1.2.4.1 Magazine »MLADJE«

The NAG proposes to continue to publish its magazine »MLADJE« (format A4; 16 pages; 2.000 copies; 3 times a year) as printed material (also available as download material on the web site) intended also for encouragement of general discussion concerning the issues related to youth work and youth policy, especially issues related to Open Method of Co-ordination, structured dialogue and European Youth Pact. (For more information see section 3.1.3)

Strategy to support National and European policy makers

Support to National Policy makers

The NAG proposes to provide support for the policy development within the national context within the following frame:

- Co-operation with national authorities responsible with youth, especially in all activities and efforts related to: implementation of the European common objectives in the field of youth and legislative initiatives intended to set up legal and other frameworks for the development of youth work in Slovenia.
- Participation at national events, organised by different actors in the field of youth, with aim to promote the priority areas of the YOUTH IN ACTION programme and participation in the structured dialogue
- Collecting examples of good practices from implemented YOUTH IN ACTION projects to be used as well as promotion of the successful projects in public via media as well as specific
- Co-operation with associations of local authorities with intention to involve them into the implementation of the YOUTH IN ACTION programme as much as possible and to motivate them to implement their own actions in the priority areas of the YOUTH IN ACTION programme, especially the area of participation and the area of youth work as learning experiences.

In addition, the NAG proposes to try to raise interest for the youth work also among more specific target groups like counsellors of local authorities elected councils and media.

Support to the European policy makers

As far as the European level is concerned, the NAG proposes that – beside the participation where it might be invited by the European Commission to contribute – to invite members of the European Parliament from Slovenia in those national activities which are suitable but especially to the yearly meeting of beneficiaries in order to provide a space for a dialogue between young people and MEP.

The NAG intends also to play a role in the preparation of the events in the field of youth during the Slovenian Presidency in the first half of 2008. The scope and the terms of this role will be negotiated with the national authorities in first half of 2007.

2. Objectives for the programme implementation

General specific objectives

Programme's general and specific objectives

The NAG intends to reach the following objectives of the Programme:

- to promote young people's active citizenship in general and their European citizenship in particular;
- to develop solidarity and promote tolerance among young people, in particular in order to reinforce social cohesion in the European Union;
- to foster mutual understanding between young people in different countries;
- to contribute to developing the quality of support systems for youth activities and the capabilities of civil society organizations in the youth field;
- to promote European cooperation in the youth field.

with its activities and efforts within the following line of work:

- information and counselling activities,
- implementation of the selection procedures as well as management of the contractualised projects afterwards, including the organisation of regular monitoring meetings with beneficiaries from September 2007 on;
- preparation and organisation of different support activities for the development of the programme as well as youth work in general
- co-operation with social partners of the programme, especially national umbrella associations of actors in the field of youth and associations of local authorities

Concrete measures to be taken in 2007 in order to achieve those objectives are described in the further text.

Programme's priorities for 2007

European Citizenship

The need for every project to have a strong European dimension should be one of the most important features for every accepted project.

In addition the NAG proposes to hold a bigger national seminar intended to promote the value and the need for European dimension in the youth work in general. The presence of members of European Parliament from Slovenia during this seminar should contribute to the awareness of the importance of the EP for the people and the possibility for dialogue between the people and the members of the EP.

The European dimension will be also strongly exposed in articles of the publication MLADJE with intention to share good practices from the projects as well as to stimulate the public discussion concerning the future of European Union. To promote the discussion about the future and the functioning of the European Union among young people the NAG also proposes to have a contest of futuristic texts made by participants of YOUTH IN ACTION projects from Slovenia in 2007 upon the topics: "European Union in 2015 in the eyes of my European friends and me" with symbolic awards.

Participation

The participation of young people as one of the key objectives of the youth work as well as one of the key approaches should be clearly visible in every project accepted

in the programme, of course, taking into the account different nature of different Actions or Sub-actions.

The NAG estimates that the most direct possibilities within the YOUTH IN ACTION programme to encourage participation of young people in civic life and participation in the representative democracy are those encompassed in format of youth democracy projects and youth initiative's projects. Therefore the NAG proposes that successful projects in those two sub action of Action 1 should be used as a tool not only to provide a space for general participation but also develop tools, structures or bodies, forms of permanent dialogue of young people with decision makers as well as joint activities with young people and decision makers at local level as well as information tools to be managed and used by young people at local or regional level since information is considered as precondition for successful participation. In those two sub-actions, the participation should be expected from the process itself but also as a visible and tangible result at the end of the project.

In all other actions, the NAG proposes that participation is understood more in general terms and therefore the successful projects might have reached a sufficient level by providing clear and direct opportunities for young people to influence the projects design, development and implementation at all stages.

With intention to avoid situation that projects are prepared and participants selected after the funding is ensured, the NAG proposes a solution which will allow NAG to continue with the practices that all applicants should submit a list of participants foreseen from Slovenia in time of the submitting of the application for any youth exchange projects, youth initiative's projects or youth democracy projects.

Cultural Diversity

Projects supported by the YOUTH IN ACTION programme must provide sufficient opportunity for the participants to discover their daily environments and to be encouraged to understand potential differences they might encounter. This opportunity should be clearly offered as a part of the preparation of participants as well as from the programme of the activities. In terms of priority, the NAG proposes to give a slight priority to those projects, which will foresee the attempt to present the rich cultural diversity of actual partners and participants to general population in the local environment as well as those projects, where the lingua franca among participants will not be the language which is currently the most used lingua franca¹.

Inclusion of young people with less opportunity

Inclusion of young people with fewer opportunities will remain strong priority in terms of the programme implementations' in Slovenia. The NAG believes that the participating groups of youngsters should reflect as much as possible also the general population in general in their local environments and involve and include also young people with fewer opportunities, especially those with lower level of education and currently out of formal educational system, unemployed young people, young people with disabilities, ethnic or any other disadvantaged group in their local context. Therefore the NAG proposes to give strong priority to projects with the participation of such groups in the selection process.

In addition, the NAG proposes to develop external network of advisers' to applicants as measure to provide extra support for the participation of non-formal groups of young people with fewer opportunities (For more information see also chapter 3.1.3).

Young people active citizenship

The NAG proposes to encourage active citizenship approach by young participants in the projects supported by YOUTH IN ACTION programme by:

- the projects and young people will be encouraged to include on their agenda items relevant for public debate in their local environment and to communicate the result of young people deliberations about such topics to all concerned
- the monitoring meetings with beneficiaries will be focused also on the potential use of the result of the projects for practice of active citizenship learning within the youth work in general

European Year of Equal opportunities

The NAG proposes to encourage applicant to include topics or element related to promotion of equal opportunities within their projects' proposals. This will be done especially during the workshops for applicants and other counselling activities. The Equal opportunities as a part of broader topics participation will be also tackled by an article in the MLADJE magazine.

The European Youth Pact

The NAG believes that the YOUTH IN ACTION programme can directly support the objectives of the European Youth Pact (EYP) by the following two objectives which might be realistic to expect from projects supported by the YOUTH IN ACTION programme:

- In all projects, learning experiences and achievements, can provide a substantial growth to employability of young people, especially those faced with unemployment and low level of education
- In youth initiative's projects, young people might be able to create conditions for their – at least part time employment after the end of the project supported by the YOUTH IN ACTION programme – by successful implementation of their youth initiative project.

Therefore the NAG proposes to evaluate any project proposal with a view of learning objectives foreseen, especially those related to key competences for lifelong learning and their links with the needs of participating young people and their future employments perspectives. The NAG also proposes that projects without clearly defined learning objectives within the context of needs of participants should not be accepted and therefore supported by the YOUTH IN ACTION programme.

In addition, the NAG proposes that youth initiative's projects which foresee existence and sustainable development, including potential for self funding also after the end of

the financial support from the YOUTH IN ACTION programme should be given a slight priority.

Mainstreaming of youth in other policies

The NAG proposes to establish a working group dedicated to the promotion of healthy life styles and risk prevention measures within the YOUTH IN ACTION projects composed by the experienced beneficiaries, governmental structures dealing with health, institutions dealing with preventions of drug abuse and others to discuss and prepare guidelines for young workers with aim to ensure active role of actors in the field of youth with regards to promotion of healthy life styles of youngsters, and especially guidelines for promotion of healthy life styles as a part of the projects supported by YOUTH IN ACTION programme.

2.2 Specific objectives for decentralised strands for each Action

2.2.1 Action 1

Youth Exchanges

Bilateral youth exchanges will be only granted to actual first time applicants and projects largely involving groups of young people with less opportunity. In addition and as an exception, the NAG proposes to allow possibility for bilateral youth exchanges also for those, who can clearly demonstrate link between particular bilateral youth exchange and other activities within "people to people co-operation" of their municipality with twin municipalities from another programme country.

The NAG proposes that all youth exchanges will clearly have to include issues related to the awareness of being citizens of European Union and provide as much as possible space for participants to discover their daily realities among participating groups, reflect upon different possibilities for young people to play active role in the field of the scope (content) of the youth exchange. As an element of the selection, the NAG propose to give a high priority to those youth exchanges which will envisage production of lasting product with results of the youth exchange which can be used by partners for dissemination in their daily work and with broader public. In addition, projects based on the partnership between youth associations and local authorities or their specialised services in the field of youth will be a strong priority.

Youth Initiatives

The NAG proposes that successful Youth initiative projects will combine a learning experience within non-formal and informal learning context for all participants with strong impact and visibility of result foreseen in the local daily environment. The successful Youth Initiative projects will be also expected to establish a working relation with local authorities and different actors in the field of youth in their local environment. Every Youth Initiative will also have to include participants' reflection about their local community and European Union within the scope (content) of their projects.

The proposals of Youth initiatives developed and submitted by non-formal groups will be a priority, and among them groups of young people with less opportunity. As far

as transnational youth initiatives are concerned, the NAG intends to give extra priority to networking projects which: a) involve partners from neighbouring countries (Italy, Austria, Hungary) with a intention to ensure partnership and co-operation also after the end of the projects as supported by the YOUTH IN ACTION programme; b) will envisage lasting products related to the priorities of the programme.

As a special feature of support in this sub action, the NAG proposes to experiment with the establishment of the network of advisors aimed at: a) support for the development of projects' proposals; b) support for the group to implement youth initiative.

Youth Democracy Projects

As far as Youth Democracy Projects are concerned, the NAG proposes to support projects following at least two or more objectives as follows: a) the establishment of voluntary democratic representative bodies of young people at the level of the municipality; b) the establishment and maintenance of permanent dialogue between young people at local level and local authorities (municipalities); c) development of different forms of dissemination of information about the issues under discussion in the municipal councils among young people in municipality; d) development of forms of regular consultation between organised and non organised youth in one hand and local authorities in other hand; consultation In addition, projects based on the partnership between youth NGO and local authorities or their specialised services in the field of youth will be a strong priority.

In terms of the requirements concerning partnership required in every Youth Democracy Projects the NAG proposes that the condition of at least two partners in one country is clearly understood as partnership of two, hierarchically independent and structurally not linked partners.

Multimeasures agreement

Due to expected lack of funds for two most popular possibilities (youth exchanges and youth initiatives) the NAG propose to accept multimeasure agreement possibility only in case the combination of activities of youth exchange(s) and youth initiative(s) and under condition, that that youth initiative is based on the expected result achieved by youth exchange or vice versa.

2.2.2 Action 2

As the only action where the quantity of projects proposals in the past years has not reached the level of full use of the funds intended for the support of EVS, the NAG propose that the achievement of adequate quantity of EVS projects is still a priority.

Quality of EVS projects

In terms of quality of projects the NAG proposes to establish a priority for those EVS activities with duration of 6 to 9 months since the duration is important feature of the educational effect of any EVS. In order to contribute to the quality of the EVS projects, priority will be given to those EVS projects – especially hosting EVS organisations – with satisfactory arrangement of mentor and his or her regular participation in the support activities of NAG designed to support and develop work of mentors in EVS projects.

In order to support the quality development of the EVS projects, the NAG also proposes to establish adequate attention within the TCP 2007 programme.

HEI accreditation

NAG proposes to continue with the ongoing task of accreditation of EVS organisations by two external accreditors and the staff of the NAG. Each new proposed EVS should be visited and – if needed – additional information, especially concerning the practical aspect of future EVS projects and the arrangement of the mentor, should be analysed by the NAG before any approval of the HEI.

EVS trainings

As far as EVS trainings are concerned, the NAG proposes to outsource the implementation of the EVS trainings programmes with aim to establish the frequency of the following number of trainings per year:

Those trainings would have to be in line with the minimum criteria for EVS trainings as published by the European Commission.

Those trainings will be monitored by the staff of the NAG by attendance of the (part) of training and by the evaluation of the reports, including the evaluations by the participants.

The NAG proposes to analyse the implementation of the EVS training programme at the end of 2007 with aim to propose and adopt necessary changes for 2008 and beyond.

2.2.3 Action 3

As far as youth exchanges with partner countries are concerned the NAG proposes to put priority to multilateral youth exchanges developed by new partnerships. In particular, the youth exchanges with partners from SEE will be promoted as a tool to address issue related to the "realities of migrants" due to extensive presence of migrant communities from SEE area in Slovenia (but also in some other European countries).

Concerning support activities with participation of partner countries the NAG proposes to give a priority to those projects' proposals aimed at building of new partnerships from the area of SEE or countries of Eastern Europe and Caucasus but good quality projects' proposals with different objectives, especially those with strong multiplication foreseen, will not be excluded.

(Comment to EC regarding EUROMED: As far as I know, There is no priority of EUROMED under Slovenian presidency. Regional priority will be integration of SEE.)

2.2.4 Action 4

The NAG wishes to mainly promote the use of Action 4.3 among already experienced users of the previous YOUTH programme but with clear priority for new comers into the programme, especially in case of:

- Feasibility visits: for all with intention to develop EVS projects or youth exchanges with involvement of youngsters with fewer opportunities
- Job shadowing visits: for all projects proposals, proposed by actors at local levels, with intention to develop or strengthen co-operation within the frame of twining local authorities in order to promote development of youth work and youth related structures at local levels
- As far as seminars and training courses are concerned, the priority will be given to the projects which will envisage lasting product with aim to disseminate result of the support activities beyond participants and partners in a particular project either for the development of the programme or objectives related to the development of the youth work within the specific framework of the applicants. In order to enhance the the potential effect of those projects, the NAG intends to invite projects promoters of projects supported under this action to different promotional activities as well as – if possible regarding the content or target – activities within TCP.

In terms of content and objectives of successful projects proposals, the NAG wish to be able to support those who envisage the enforcement of effective methods and approaches to tackle programme priorities either in youth work in general or in future projects supported by YOUTH IN ACTION programme. In terms of development or innovative work, the NAG foresee also a strong possibility to support partner finding activities for newcomers to the programme as well as development of new methods and approaches to be used in youth work, especially those suitable for different groups of young people with less opportunity.

The NAG also proposes that at least one project intended to provide support partner finding for the implementation of EVS projects for new EVS organisation is granted, preferably to the EVS Advice and Support Organisation which will be identified and chosen by NAG trough open call in second half of 2007.

2.2.5 Action 5

With relative limited funds available to support possibilities within sub action 5.1 the NAG proposes to establish green light only for projects of national youth seminars which will: a) ensure input to the seminar by youth organisations and groups of young people from local level throughout Slovenia as well as dissemination of the result back to local level; b) ensure participation of different actors in the field of youth and make sure that representativity of the participation is ensured; c) have a clear product to be disseminated throughout Slovenia beyond actual participants or participating youth organisations and groups and to be

In addition, the NAG proposes to the National authorities to establish additional financial support in order to stimulate development of such projects and by doing so also support the involvement of young people in the structural dialogue at European level.

The NAG will also inform potential applicant that involvement of the National authorities in the preparation and implementation of projects' proposals would be good in order to use opportunities of this action as a part of the preparation of the Slovenian presidency in first half of 2008.

3. Complementarities with other EU programmes and initiatives

The NAG proposes to hold an introductory meeting with responsible staff of the National agency for LIFE LONG LERANING programme in order to:

- Identify the possibilities within two programmes which are suitable for main targets of actors for both programmes and include reference to those possibilities in general presentation of the YOUTH IN ACTION programme within our information work
- Exchange printed and other information material in order to ensure synergy with promotional activities with LIFE LONG LERNING programme and CULTURE 2000 programme

The NAG also proposes to reinforce working relation with the representation of the European Commission in Slovenia which has already started in November 2006. The co-operation with representation might increase the visibility of the YOUTH IN ACTION programme and also provide some synergy in their activities in the field of youth.

MANAGEMENT OF PROJECT LIFE – CYCLE

1. Grant allocation policy

Grant award criteria

The NAG proposes to use the assessment grid to assess received applications which are eligible for funding within the YOUTH IN ACTION programme. The assessment grid, based on the points system, will include elements aimed to ensure that objectives of the programme are reached as well as it will take into the account overall quality of each proposed project. The result of this exercise, made by at least two programme officers and calculation of the average number of points, will be the only base for the NAG to propose acceptance or rejection of the projects, except in case of first time applicants.² For those the NAG proposes to be accepted into the programme as priority if they reach at least 70% of average result of the assessment of the application in each action.

In addition, the NAG proposes that national criteria are part of the assessment grid and project fulfilling those criteria are given strong priority in the selection process.

- Projects proposed by local associations of young people with strong co-operation with municipality (with aim to straighten local associations and their co-operation with local authorities)
- Projects involving several actors from the same municipality (with aim to promote co-operation of different actors in the field of youth at local level.

In case of lack of funds to grant all eligible and quality projects, the NAG propose to use additional measures to ensure diversity of beneficiary with intended result to have as many as possible different beneficiaries; Furthermore, if the need be, the NAG also proposes to use measures to ensure equal implementation among different parts of Slovenia.

The NAG will run required check of financial capability of applicant in case that grant is higher then 25.000 €. For non – profit organisations and associations, established within last 12 months before the selection round and informal groups and in case that they apply for grant higher then 10.000€, the NAG proposes to secure the prepayment of grant with additional suitable guaranties from municipalities or other suitable source.

Allocation of funds per selection round

The NAG will reserve the following funds for each action throughout the 5 selection rounds in 2007. Those amounts – except R5 selection round – might be increased up to 30% and the NAG will manage this flexible in order to follow the demand in different actions.

² The NAG proposes to consider as first time applicant any legal person or group which has not received yet a grant from YOUTH or YOUTH IN ACTION programme within last 5 years.

If the funds will not be spent within designated selection round, all unspent funds will be transferred to the next selection round.

Reallocation of funds among actions / sub actions

The NAG proposes not use the possibility of reallocation of +/- 20% funds among actions until R4 selection round. On the basis of application received for the R4 selection round, the NAG will analyse the need for any reallocation and will – if necessary – made reallocation of +/- 20% of funds among the actions, taking into the account the ambition to support as many participants as possible during the R4 and R5 selection rounds as well as the needs in different actions.

Funds recovery policy

The NAG proposes to check the state of the funds repay requests before any payment is made to any beneficiary. In case that a beneficiary should return funds to the NAG, the NAG will deduct the owed sum from the payment.

The NAG proposes to follow the following policy aiming to recover any funds owed by the beneficiary:

- A reminder to be send within two weeks after non compliance with the request to repay funds
- A recommended letter to be send with one months after non compliance with the request to repay funds

The NAG also proposes that any beneficiary, which has not repaid any amount due within one month after the request for repayment has been issued, is excluded from possibility to get any new grant or be able to take part in any support activities of the NAG. If the sum of not repaid funds will be higher then 500 € the NAG will inform other national agencies and national authorities in Slovenia with a request not to support such partner in any project proposed.

In addition and in case that the repayment will not be made within six months, the NAG proposes to start the legal action by a request to legal office to send a request before the legal action. Before making any further step, the NAG will consult with European Commission.

2. Complementary funding

³ Excluding 5% or 25.000 € intended to co-fund EVS Advice and Support Organization

The NAG will not be in position to administer any funds from national or local authorities intended for additional support projects already supported by the YOUTH IN ACTION programme. Never the less, the NAG will promote the need to ensure co-funding of the projects by the beneficiaries during its information activities as well as activities intended to support applicants.

3. Projects' monitoring

The monitoring of the accepted projects will be ensured by:

- a) desk monitoring
- b) monitoring meetings and monitoring visits

Desk monitoring

The NAG proposes to perform desk monitoring which will be implemented via the e-mail contacts with projects and analyses of midterm and final reports.

Monitoring meetings with beneficiaries

The NAG proposes to hold monitoring meetings with beneficiaries with intention to monitor the development of the projects and with intention to provide a space and opportunity for beneficiaries to share their experiences, exchange good practices and ideas but also to identify obstacles and difficulties and use those occasions also as a possibility to provide general guidance to projects. In terms of quantity of those meetings, the NAG proposes to hold three such meetings in 2007, with the first one in May 2007.

In order to ensure the participation of the beneficiaries at those meetings, the NAG proposes to explicitly include the participation at those meetings as contractual obligation of every beneficiary in the grant awarding contract with beneficiary throughout the duration of the projects.

Monitoring visits of projects

Monitoring visits as on site visits will be performed by the NAG staff with objective to verify:

- the existence of the projects and the activity
- the compliance of the actual programme of the activity / the state of the projects' development with programme and information as provided in the accepted application
- the number of participants / partners involved in the projects as well as other numerative elements important for the calculation of the amount of the grant
- the level of participation of participants in the preparation of the project as well as implementation of the projects so far
- compliance with the guidelines for visual valorisation

Monitoring visits will be also opportunity to identify potential shortcomings or difficulties and to provide some counselling to the beneficiary during the projects implementation with objective to overcome those shortcomings, underperformance or difficulties.

Projects to be visited will be selected on the random basis, taking into the account the geographical spread of accepted projects and the type of beneficiaries. In addition to this, NAG reserves a possibility to implement an ad hoc monitoring visit as a result of the analyses of midterm report from the beneficiary or any information received from participants or other national agencies about the individual project. The NAG commits itself to implement monitoring visits to the extent that NAG will be able to report:

- Continuation of the implementation of monitoring visit in order to be able to reach at least 10% of accepted projects and at least 20% of allocated grants in 2006
- Implementation at least 10% of accepted projects and at least 20% of allocated grants in 2007 in each action or sub-action

The beneficiaries will be informed by the intention of the NAG to perform the monitoring visit in writing in advance but whenever possible, the exact date of the visit will not be disclosed. The verification of fact related to the actual implementation of the projects will be based on the monitoring visits check lists. After the visit, the NAG will produce a draft report which will also identify potential shortcomings and timeframe for any improvement needed, especially for longer term projects. Draft report, which might include also examples of good practices or interesting approaches by the beneficiary, will be sent to the beneficiary for eventual comments to be given within 15 days. On that basis, the NAG will produce final report which will be also sent to the National authorities for their use.

In-depth audit of beneficiaries

Beside the monitoring meeting and visits, the NAG proposes also to perform a limited number (up to ten beneficiaries) of in-depth audit of beneficiary intended to establish full picture of their implementation of the projects in accordance with their contractual obligations. Those in-depth audits will be performed once the final report is submitted and accepted. The scope of those audits will be focused on verification that:

- the grant was use for the purpose of the project(s) and activity or activities
- the grant has not gave a rise of direct profit for the beneficiary and that co-funding of the total of projects costs have been ensured

The selection of beneficiaries to be exposed to in-depth audit will be made on the basis random selection but also those, where results of the analyses of the final report might ask for potential follow up by the NAG.

3.1 INFORMATION AND VALORISATION

General

The general priority of the NAG concerning the information work in 2007 will be dedicated to the promotion of the new programme YOUTH IN ACTION. This promotion work will include two main directions:

- To inform users of the previous programme about changes and new possibilities within the new programme
- To inform potential newcomers with possibility to step into the programme.

The NAG proposes to continue with establish communication channels and practices concerning the dissemination of the information about the programme and its possibility. The NAG also proposes to develop strategy in order to achieve more presence in the media concerning projects supported by the YOUTH IN ACTION programme as well as existence of the programme itself. As a part of that strategy, the beneficiaries within the programme will be invited to collect different published articles about their projects in local media in order to present them at the end of the year during the annual evaluation meeting of the beneficiaries.

In order to widen the target public the NAG proposes to identify new potential frameworks, especially those with focus on young people with fewer opportunities. Our priority in this aspect will be young people with lower education, either unemployed or even employed. The NAG proposes to investigate possibilities of promotion via the Trade Unions and Labour offices.

In line with efforts to involve local authorities and to provide better link between their efforts to support the projects within the programme, the NAG proposes to issue a prize for the "most supportive local authority" and present this prize at the end of the year during the annual evaluation meeting. This action should provide local efforts with national dimension and – hopefully – also set up example to be followed in the future years.

The NAG will maintain the e-newsletter and news as main tool for quick communication to the potential users of the programme. The announcement of the possibility to enrol to the subscribers' list will be announced at every occasion (event, publication, activities, letters to applicants and beneficiaries, etc.)

The NAG will also visualize the programme YOUTH IN ACTION by writing the name of this programme in capital letters.

Co-operation with EURODESK

The EURODESK structure in Slovenia is a part of the NAG and thus the optimatisation of its work and efforts to avoid any functional overlapping will be ensured by the management of the NAG. In particular this will result in:

- Information published and provided by EURODESK will be complementary to those which will be published and provided by NAG and vice-versa. The NAG will also refer to EURODESK for complementary information (for example; funding possibilities if the idea can not be realised within the YOUTH IN ACTION programme).
- The main communication channel for the NAG to publish open calls and invitations to support activities and other activities related to the YOUTH IN ACTION programme will be EURODESK e-news as one of the prime and easy reachable European opportunities for young people in Slovenia
- Implementation of the YOUTH IN ACTION programme will also benefit from web based tool developed by EURODESK with intention to publish different request for partnerships as well as partner finding searches

In addition, the visual outlook of website and printed materials for the implementation of the programme and EURODESK will have the same basis and they will include the new graphic cart of DG EAC and logos.

The NAG will also use common staff meetings as additional tool of the co-ordination between EURODESK and NAG.

National website on the YOUTH IN ACTION programme

The NAG proposes to redesign the present web site of the YOUTH programme in Slovenia in order to also visually mark the arrival of the new programme and to restructure the content of the website in order to achieve more efficient »travel« throughout the content.

The NAG will publish the following information and documents on its website:

- a) Programme related documents and forms such as: Decision of the Council and European parliament establishing YOUTH IN ACTION programme; Programme Guide; Work programme of the European Commission; Work programme of the National agencies; Applications and report forms
- b) Programme implementation related information such as: Decisions concerning the acceptance of the projects' proposals into the programme; good practises and links to the projects supported under the YOUTH IN ACTION programme.

The renewed website with new address www.mva.si (mva stands for the programme name in Slovenian language: Mladi V Akciji) will also include link to the European Commission website and other links related to the programme (Partnership between CoE and European Commission; SALTO YOUTH; Eurodesk and others)

The renewed website will also include section regarding contacts with programme officers at the National agency, responsible for particular action(s) or sub-action(s). The graphic layout of the website will incorporate new graphic chart of DG EAC for logo section and the web site will offer downloads of logos to be used by beneficiary within the implementation of the projects, including their dissemination for results.

The information on the web site will also include a yearly calendar of activities organised by or on behalf of NAG and other material.

Information, promotion and counselling of potential applicants

3.1.3.1 Information and promotion

Regional general presentation of the programme

The NAG proposes to prepare and organise 12 regional general presentation of the programme in order to bring the programme as close as possible to the potential end users. During the preparation of each of those presentations an effort should be made to attract new actors to come and learn about the possibilities. The general presentation should ends with a possibility for potential users to have face-to-face consultation with the programme officer aimed at: a) encouraging potential users to develop projects able to seek support from the YOUTH in action programme; b) give guidance concerning possibilities to get involved in the support activities of the NAG.

Magazine »MLADJE«

NAG proposes to continue to publish its magazine »MLADJE« (format A4; 16 pages; 2.000 copies; 3 times a year) as printed material (also available as download material on the web site) intended for:

- Encouragement of general discussion concerning the issues related to youth work and youth policy, especially issues related to Open Method of Co-ordination, structures dialogue and European Youth Pact at European level
- Presentation of good practices or interesting approaches and results / products from the projects supported by the YOUTH IN ACTION programme, especially those tackling general programme priorities (European citizenship, participation, cultural diversity and inclusion of young people with less opportunity)
- Announcement of lasting information related to the implementation of the programme YOUTH IN ACTION

Every issue of the magazine will also include a permanent short presentation of the new YOUTH IN ACTION programme.

Publication »MLADI V AKCIJI«

The NAG proposes to develop and publish a short publication but in large quantity (B5 format, 8 pages, and 10.000 copies) with aim to shortly present:

- The existence of the programme and its possibility
- The programme's priorities
- The ways to enter the programme

This publication shall be used as main printed material for promotion of the programme at different occasion but also spread throughout Slovenia through the network of youth information activities at local levels as hands outs to those interested to start to discover opportunities within the YOUTH IN ACTION programme.

Publications coming out of activities

Beside regular magazine »MLADJE« several other publications as a part of the follow up of information as well as TCP activities are planned as a results / products of activities with intention to summarize the content of activities and to make the topics / issues more familiar to actors in the field of youth as well as to spread result of those activities beyond the direct participants of the activities.

In this frame the NAG propose to publish the following publications:

- Publication aimed at encouragement of the development of Youth Democracy projects and encouragement of young people to participate in the system of representative democracy
- Publication aimed at promotion of inclusion of the European citizenship as important element in every day youth activities as well as guidance to basic rights (and obligations) of European Citizen
- Publication aimed at development of youth initiatives and involvement of young people with fewer opportunities

3.1.3.2 Counselling of applicants

Workshops for the support of potential applicants

NAG proposes to hold regular workshops aimed at close support of potential applicants before each application deadline – e.g. five times a year. The workshop organised approximately 4 – 3 weeks before the deadline will provide guidance through application forms for different actions and will serve as opportunity to remind potential applicants of all important expectations of the programme towards projects but also to inform about responsibilities and obligations for beneficiary after the acceptance of the projects into the programme.

Applicants' advisors

The NAG proposes to establish a network of experienced youth workers, familiar with the youth exchanges and youth initiatives, to be able to provide extra support for groups of young people with less opportunity to prepare a quality projects' proposal. Interested non-formal groups might access this support benefit by request to the NAG with short description of the projects' idea, which will be used by NAG to match with adequate and available advisors. The process will start with open invitation to the interested and experienced youth workers and continue with basic training with aim to present expectations of the YOUTH IN ACTION programme towards youth initiatives and youth exchanges. At the end of the year the evaluation meeting,

including representatives of groups supported under this support measure, will be held to evaluate experiences made and results achieved.

The NAG proposes to ensure possibility that at least 15 groups with intention to propose projects within Action 1.2 will be able to benefit from this applicant advisors' support service.

Support for partner-finding

Since one of the services provided by the network of EURODESK is also dedicated to the support for partner search the NAG propose that those services are also fully used by the actors in the field of youth wishing to establish new partnership. As a part of those efforts EURODESK Slovenia developed a web site tool intended to publish different requests for partner-findings. Therefore, the NAG will ensure that possibility to learn about potential partners for future projects within the YOUTH IN ACTION programme will be provided by EURODESK Slovenia.

The NAG also proposes to use possibilities within TCP as direct efforts to provide matching opportunities for different actors to find suitable partners and to start discussions concerning the projects' ideas. In this frame, the NAG intends to organize three partnership building seminars in co-operation with other national agencies (one hosting) in order to provide possibilities for those without any partners or those who would like to enlarge their partnerships' network.

Support and monitoring of grant beneficiaries

Direct support by the NAG

The NAG proposes to offer a clear possibility to every beneficiary and projects to seek support or advice from the staff of the NAG during the implementation of the projects. With this intention, the NAG intends to establish a help line (e-mail address monitoring@mva.si and telephone line) and to communicate this contact details to every accepted projects at the same time as information about the acceptance of the project into the programme.

Handbook for beneficiaries

The NAG proposes to develop until the end of the 2007 a Manual with guidelines for main expectations towards the implementation of the projects, including chapter on visualisation of projects, measures concerning minors' protections. The publication should also include some examples of practices from projects or examples of general policies or set of measures by beneficiaries. Publication will be printed in smaller number of copies but the main instrument of the distribution would be via download from the programme website in Slovenia.

The handbook as an extra tool for the beneficiaries should be developed on the basis of frequently asked questions by beneficiaries' trough 2007 and should be up-dated annually on the bases of the new development of the programme (Programme Guide, Handbook of the Commission) and the questions from beneficiaries.

EVS Advice and Support organisation

The EVS Advice and Support organisations will represent additional measure to support the development of EVS projects as well as the support for the improvement of the quality of the EVS implementation in Slovenia. Therefore the NAG proposes to identify the EVS Advice and Support Organisation through public invitation and to conclude with the selected body a contractual relation throughout the duration of the programme YOUTH IN ACTION. The criteria for the selection of EVS ASO should – beside its experience with EVS - be based on:

- Ability of the body to provide face to face consultation to potential volunteers and those interested to become EVS organisations in 5 bigger towns in Slovenia in different parts of the country through its branches or co-operation partners
- Quality of proposal of the strategy to increase the number of EVS organisations as well as strategy and proposal of yearly work programme to contribute to the support of the EVS organisations as well as volunteers.
- Co-funding possibility of the body to contribute to the costs of the implementation of their tasks and responsibilities

Monitoring of accredited EVS organisations

The NAG propose to establish a monitoring mechanism for all accredited EVS organisations which will include desk monitoring and – as far as it is possible a visit to accredited EVS organisation as a part of the monitoring visits and – at least once a year – meeting with accredited organisation.

The NAG proposes to - within its financial abilities – establish a working group composed of EVS accredited organisation which will have two aims: a) identify and – as far as it is possible – develop measures to overcome obstacles or shortcomings for the development of EVS; b) Monitor the quality of the EVS trainings in Slovenia.

The NAG would propose that – on the basis of the results of the work of such group – EVS AVS should apply for one adequate project within Action 4.3. Also the mentor training, foreseen under TCP plan for 2007, should be developed in line with the outcomes of the work of this group.

Dissemination and exploitation of result of supported activities

The NAG proposes to use several possibilities to disseminate and exploit results of supported activities, namely:

- Articles about projects in magazine MLADJE
- Providing a space for the presentation of good practices and good projects and ideas at different occasion but especially during the yearly meeting of beneficiaries
- By establishing a special section on the programme web site with links to most successful projects (if present on the web)

In addition, the NAG proposes to encourage beneficiaries to collect articles about their projects in local or regional newspapers and magazines and provide copies to the NAG. NAG intends to use such material for national wide information to the media

about the existence of the YOUTH IN ACTION programme and successful projects within.

Analysis of programme results and evaluation of the programme impact

Monitoring and evaluation of programme's actions

The NAG proposes that the implementation of the programme's action will be monitored and evaluated at two levels:

- Via the data concerning accepted projects in order to provide information concerning gender balance, implementation of the regional balances, new applicant and projects with participation of youngsters with less opportunity, thematic content of the projects etc. This data should be collected at each selection round.
- Via the monitoring and analyses of the final reports with comparison of planned and achieved results of activities and their projects.

In addition to this, the NAG propose so use a questionnaire to all accepted projects in 2007 with aim to get – as far as it is possible - their perspective on (expected) longer term impact of their projects. This questionnaire should be sent out towards the end of the year 2007.

Annual report on the results

The NAG proposes to start the drafting of the 2007 annual report in order to have a full and detailed report ready at the end of January 2008.

3.2 - NA training and cooperation plan (TCP)

1. Main priorities (short résumé – ref. previous chapters in the work programme)

The NAG proposes that TCP 2007 would be focused on three main priorities:

- 1.1 Support for the priority areas of the programme (especially European citizenship and participation) with national seminar “importance of European dimension in the youth work” and European seminar “ATOQ – European dimension in projects”
- 1.2 Support for the improvement of EVS projects (especially focused on the role of mentors and good preparation and planning of EVS projects and activities) and the improvement of youth initiatives (especially their capacity to provide learning experiences and use of the implementation of the youth initiatives as learning tool for participating group) with one national and one European training seminars for EVS mentors and national seminar dedicated to the development of youth initiatives and the involvement of young people with fewer opportunities within youth initiatives
- 1.3 Support for newcomers (new applicants) in the programme and development of the new action within the YOUTH IN ACTION programme with partnership building activity for development of youth exchanges and national seminar dedicated to the development of Youth Democracy projects

2. Activity monitoring and evaluation (criteria for selection of participants, follow-up of participants, evaluation of results, etc.)

The NAG proposes that the recruitment of participants would start with calls for participation and that the selection of actual participants would be based on the following general criteria; experiences within the YOUTH / YOUTH in action programme; regional balances of the origin of participants and gender balance. Specific activities might have additional criteria, based on the requirements of particular activity.

As far as follow up of the participants and evaluation of their participation is concerned, the NAG proposes to use the following strategy; The participants would be required to produce a written report after the activity with focus on the use of experiences gained in their future work. The participants would be then contacted by the staff of the NAG again after 6 – 9 months with purpose to monitor any development coming out of their participation. The NAG also proposes to hold meeting with (at least some) participants of the TCP activities implemented in 1007 at the end of the year 2007 with aim to contribute to the development of training strategy in 2008.
